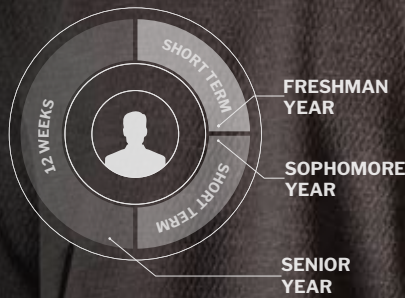

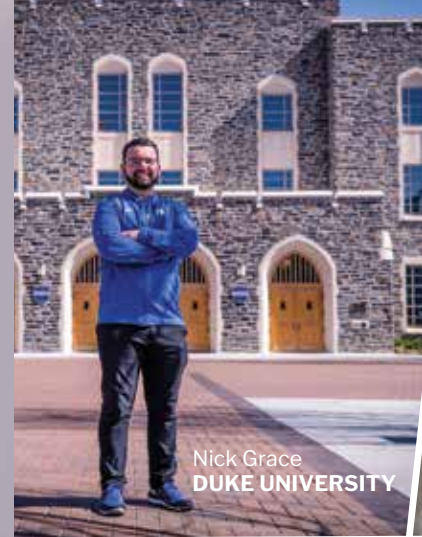

Jackie Ruggiero Huntington Beach, California

Major: Nursing
Internship: Massachusetts General Hospital

For Jackie Ruggiero '23, the most important lesson she learned at Endicott was to “try not to take life too seriously.” Ruggiero’s favorite place to do that is Endicott’s Hempstead Stadium in between the goalposts with her cleats digging into the turf and her eyes trained on the ball.

Growing up in Huntington Beach, Calif., a severe accident led to a life-altering hand injury that was excruciating to get through daily activities with, let alone play as goalie. Her dreams of playing college soccer dimmed and her school days were punctuated by agonizing physical therapy sessions. Ultimately, a doctor suggested an operation to amputate her fingers might offer relief. A difficult decision to make at just 17.

The operation was successful and soon Ruggiero was playing soccer again. In the back of her mind, she had a dream of net-keeping for a college women’s team at a school with a strong nursing program. Endicott couldn’t have been a better fit. “Because it’s a small school, you really get to know people who both work here and go here. Endicott feels like a family away from home,” Ruggiero said.

It’s been all about those relationships for her—from her teammates to Assistant Director of Athletic Facilities Mark Kulakowski, who always has a friendly word to share, to Assistant Professor of Nursing Bethany Nasser, who impacted Ruggiero with her open-minded teaching style. Being a Gull has meant connecting.

JoaoPaulo Miranda Peabody, Massachusetts

JoaoPaulo “JP” Miranda '23 is big on quality. “Quality relationships, quality products, quality services, those things I value tremendously,” he said.

Raised by parents who both own small businesses, Miranda has seen the reward of giving people the best of the best. Since childhood, he found himself constantly observing how businesses work, from the perspective of an individual employee to the entire management system. So, it made sense when he chose a business management major at Endicott.

At Endicott, Miranda recognized quality. He was in awe of the campus and the energy of the students and he forged close connections with everyone from Executive Director of the Angle Center Gina Deschamps to Assistant Vice President and Dean of Students Marlin Nabors.

Caitlyn Sievers Salem, Connecticut

Growing up, Caitlyn Sievers '23 heard the phrase “100% or nothing” frequently from her mother and stepfather. Fast forward to her senior year at Endicott, and these words couldn’t be truer.

President of Student Government Association (SGA). Orientation leader and tour guide. Vice President of Psi Chi Honor Society. A member of Mortar Board and the Alpha Phi Sigma Society.

“I think I’ve always lived my life that way, being super passionate and seeing things through 100%,” said Sievers. “I can’t imagine doing something another way.”

The psychology major may do it all, but she uses her multiple platforms to help those around her first. Sievers thrives on being busy, and it gives her a purpose every day.

“What I’m interested in is helping people be the best versions of themselves, and doing the things that I can to be a bridge for that,” said Sievers.

Sievers said it’s important to give back to the College, a place where the experience is very much give-and-take.

“As a student, you’re getting so much support from your friends, the people you meet, your faculty, advisors, and other staff on campus that support you,” she said. “It’s important to give that back just as much. Be a support for the same place that was really impactful on your educational and social experience.”

She’ll take with her lessons from Endicott, like resiliency. She’s learned not to catastrophize but to put things into perspective. That was something she learned while studying abroad in Prague, Czech Republic, during her junior year. As the only Endicott student in Prague, she learned to slow down and appreciate the little things. And while it’s bittersweet to leave Endicott, she’ll build on the optimism and drive she cultivated here in law school.

“I really love this place, and I care so much about it,” she said. “So, I just want to leave it better than I found it.”

“If you’re reading this and you’re about to come to Endicott, I can’t stress enough that you should try to get as many experiences as possible while you’re here. If someone invites you to go out somewhere and try something new, just say yes,” she said.

Now, she plans to pass the national nursing licensure exams and get a full-time job in a Boston-area hospital. “Knowing that I can make someone else’s day better with my presence is all I’ve ever wanted,” she said.

Miranda became an Orientation Leader and a Resident Assistant and was named a Presidential Ambassador. His ambitious nature, coupled with his work ethic, eventually led to his greatest opportunity yet—an internship at the Massachusetts-based biotech giant Moderna.

As Moderna’s R&D quality intern, Miranda helped teams in their development of quality, life-saving drugs. He reported directly to the vice president and worked with a hand-picked leadership team. Miranda, who’d been focused on pursuing a high-quality life and inspiring the same in those around him, had finally found a career that matched his higher calling.

Just recently, Moderna asked Miranda to come aboard as a full-time Project Coordinator after he graduates from Endicott. “I like to keep the ball moving, and I’m very ambitious. I just run after things,” he said. “I always like to say that it’s not the destination that matters, it’s the journey. The journey is really what’s going to define you.”

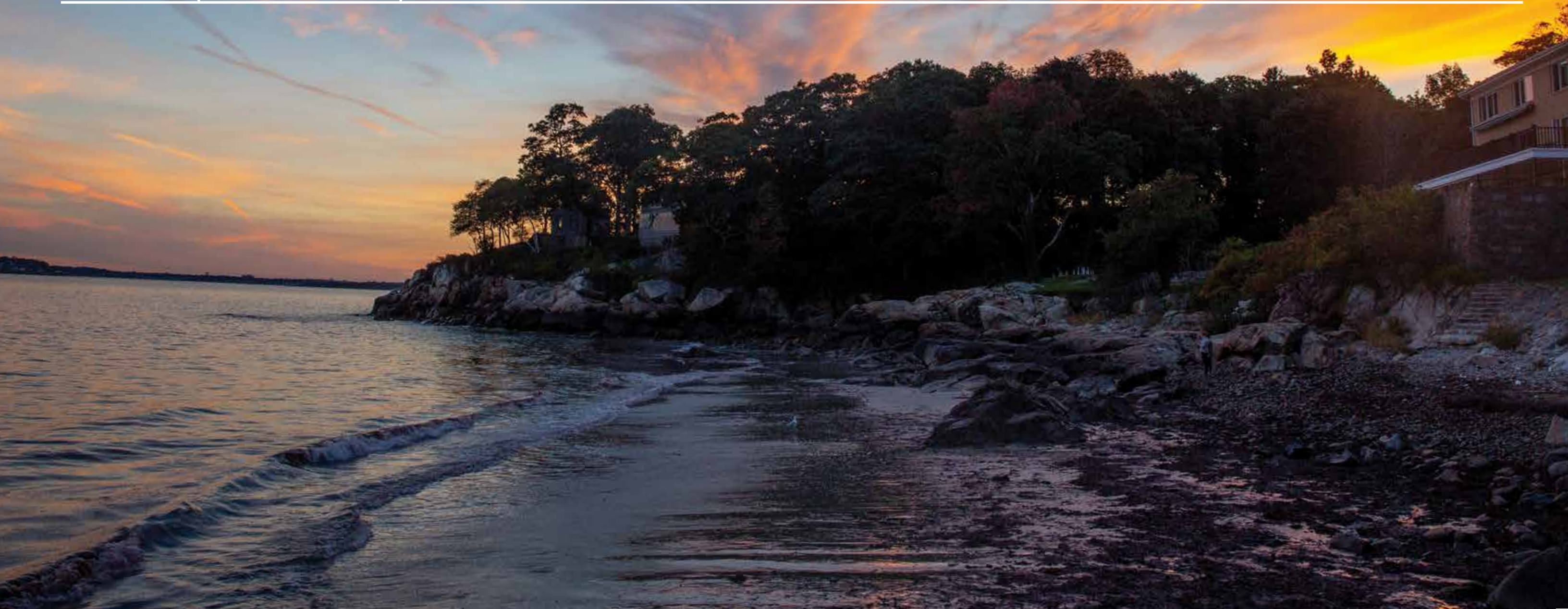

Dina Gentile
Professor of Sport Management
School of Sport Science

The primary driver of the Esports Management degree program at Endicott, Dr. Dina Gentile is helping students tap into a new and fast-advancing industry. The author of *Introduction to Esports Management*, Gentile wrote the textbook mainly inspired by her observations of the strategies and online relationships her son was building as a gamer. Through the program, Gentile is changing the way schools adopt and embrace esports management as an academic discipline. Using existing classes in computer science, the professor is allowing esports students to get a more technical curriculum that tailors their knowledge to include game programming and design. Gentile has presented her work at the AAHPERD Convention, NASSM Conferences, COSMA Conferences, and MAHPERD Convention.



Luke Reynolds
Assistant Professor
School of Education

The author of 17 books, Dr. Luke Reynolds most recently turned his pen toward the stories of 60 public figures who each turned a personal trauma into resilience. Reynolds intimately understands trauma—years ago, he survived a head-on collision and is lucky to be alive. In his latest book, *Braver Than I Thought*, “I wanted to explore people I admired and look at their lives through the lens of how they learned to live with trauma, cope with it, and still be the best versions of themselves,” he said.

School of Science and Technology

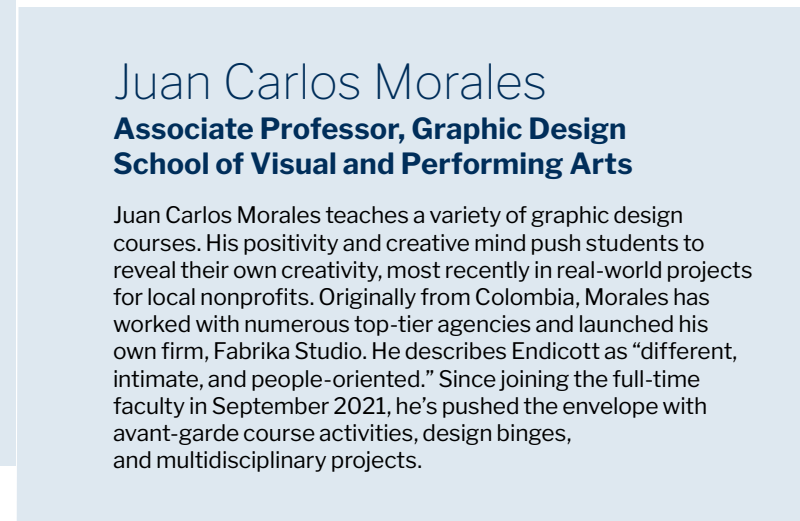

Meet Your Professors



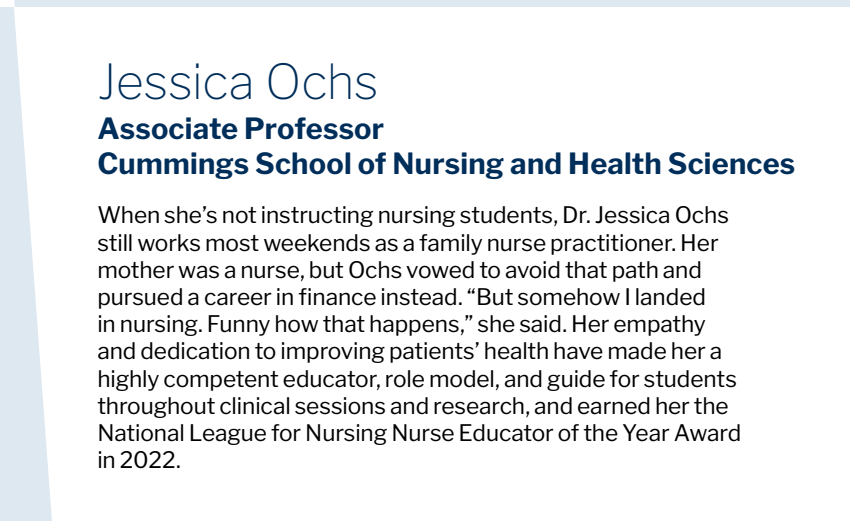
Elizabeth Matelski
Associate Professor of History

Passionate about American multiculturalism, popular culture, and incorporating digital technology into her history teachings, Dr. Liz Matelski has most recently delved into the legacy of American slavery to uncover the truth behind the namesake of Endicott’s own Mingo Beach. A recipient of the 2022 inaugural Tadler Center Fellowship, Matelski is also Co-Director of the National Endowment for the Humanities Summer Seminar “The Salem Witch Trials: Their World and Legacy,” a three-week institute for middle and high school teachers held in July 2023. She was the recipient of the 2022 Endicott Academic Excellence Award.



Juan Carlos Morales
Associate Professor, Graphic Design
School of Visual and Performing Arts

Juan Carlos Morales teaches a variety of graphic design courses. His positivity and creative mind push students to reveal their own creativity, most recently in real-world projects for local nonprofits. Originally from Colombia, Morales has worked with numerous top-tier agencies and launched his own firm, Fabrika Studio. He describes Endicott as “different, intimate, and people-oriented.” Since joining the full-time faculty in September 2021, he’s pushed the envelope with avant-garde course activities, design binges, and multidisciplinary projects.



Jessica Ochs
Associate Professor
Cummings School of Nursing and Health Sciences

When she’s not instructing nursing students, Dr. Jessica Ochs still works most weekends as a family nurse practitioner. Her mother was a nurse, but Ochs vowed to avoid that path and pursued a career in finance instead. “But somehow I landed in nursing. Funny how that happens,” she said. Her empathy and dedication to improving patients’ health have made her a highly competent educator, role model, and guide for students throughout clinical sessions and research, and earned her the National League for Nursing Nurse Educator of the Year Award in 2022.



Anna McAlister
Faculty Department Lead and Professor
Curtis L. Gerrish School of Business

A native Australian, Dr. Anna McAlister is a consumer psychology expert who researches the impact of marketing messages on children, teens, and young adults. McAlister’s research evidence has contributed to public policy discussions on topics such as fast food marketing, alcohol advertising, promotion of healthy foods, unit pricing, and cyberbullying. She serves on the editorial review board of the *Journal of Interactive Advertising* and is a deputy editor for the *Journal of Marketing Communications*. She is regularly recognized as a Woman of Impact at Endicott and was the 2020 recipient of the Academic Excellence Award.
