Residence Life

Summer Housing begins on May 28 and runs until August 16. Students can apply now in their housing portal until May 12 for summer housing. Students must have an on campus job, a campus sponsored internship, an athletic requirement, or be participating in on campus classes in order to qualify for summer housing.

Office of Sustainability

During Move Out's College Cleanse, an initiative from the Offices of Community Service and Sustainability, students who no longer need items can donate them for reuse instead of tossing them. Boxes are placed in residence halls for collection from Monday, April 29 to Friday, May 10. Donation categories include clothing & shoes, non-perishable food, books & school supplies, and dorm supplies. We encourage our Gulls to be respectful and not leave mattress toppers, pillows, rugs, or trash! Last year, 8,000 lbs of material, at an estimated value of about \$30,000, was diverted from the landfill.
